Dear Community Members,

Before we see one another again, we'll be observing the Advent "Ember Days." I'm sure you remember a few things about ember days, but, just as a reminder, they are three days (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday) of mortification and penance which occur at the change of season. Besides Advent (winter), they occur in Lent (spring), during the Octave of Pentecost (summer) and September (fall). I'll tell you more about the Pentecost Ember Days when the time comes.

It is also on Ember Wednesday of this week that we begin the time of the "O Antiphons." They extend from December 17 through 23 inclusive. These days are known as "Greater Ferias" of Advent. The Ember Days and Greater Ferias of Advent have liturgical precedence. The only saint who has a feast day during this period is St. Thomas the Apostle. His feast would have been celebrated were it not for the fact that it falls on this Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Advent. St. Tomas' feast is only of the II class and is, therefore, trumped by the Sunday.

This weekend marks our entrance into the final stretch of Advent before Christmas. Because it's relatively short, and because there are so many distractions, Advent can slip by almost before we know it. Perhaps the next three days would be a time to double or triple our efforts to prepare for Our Lord's coming.

Once again, I'd like to remind you about out Christmas Mass schedule. The Vigil Mass for Our Lord's Nativity (the Christmas Eve Mass) will be celebrated at 7:15 AM Wednesday. This is a departure from our normal weekday Mass schedule. Though I'm sure that no one really needs to be reminded of this, the Christmas Eve Mass does NOT fulfill your Holy Day obligation.

The First Mass of Christmas will be celebrated at 12:00 AM December 25; the Mass at Dawn at 7:00 AM and the Mass of the Day at 11:00 AM. The Masses on December 26 and 27 will follow our normal, weekday schedule. Masses for The Octave Day of the Nativity (January 1) will follow our normal Sunday schedule.

Our seminary custom was to wait until First Vespers of the Nativity to extend the proper form of the "Happy Holidays" wish, so, until then, may God help us to make the most of the remaining days of Advent, my children and my friends.
