Once again, a Blessed Christmas to you all. Unlike the rest of secular society, we know that Christmas doesn't end on December 26. We celebrate Christmas up through 2 February, the day when Our Lord was presented in the temple and Our Lady underwent her purification. This coming year, however, there will be a tiny "blip." You see, Septuagesima begins on 1 February. No matter, even without the 'Alleluia' in the office and at Mass, Our Lord will still be presented, Our Lady purified and our candles blessed. Let's start thinking about that.

Here are a few other things to think about: Masses on the Octave Day of Christmas will follow our normal Sunday schedule. I'll be blessing Epiphany Water on Monday, 5 January at 5:00 PM. There will be enough Water to go around, no worries about that. I'll also be blessing gold, frankincense and myrrh and chalk, of course. Masses on 6 January, The Epiphany of Our Lord will be at 7:15 AM and (Sung Mass) at 7:00 PM. I will be out of town and out of state from Wednesday, 7 January, following a specially scheduled 7:15 AM Mass, through Friday, 16 January, when I will return in time for the normally scheduled 6 PM Mass. Father Michael Bass will substitute for me on Sunday 11 January, for both Masses, of course, and Monday, 12 January, for the 7:15 AM Mass. There will be **no** Masses celebrated here *Thursday, Friday, Saturday, 8, 9, 10 January*. There will also be **no** Masses here *Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, 13, 14, 15 January*. Please give careful attention to the two bulletins published during that period.

I thank you once again for the cards and gifts many of you presented me with and I thank once again all community members who gave so much of their time and effort to ensure a worthy Christmas celebration for Our Blessed Lord. Though I would like to do so again in this letter, I fear I wouldn't have enough space. Besides, those people know who they are and they give of themselves with no desire for public thanks. Their service is a true example of stewardship in action with much love and devotion poured into the mix as well.
