Dear Community Members,

Well, as if I hadn't had enough priestly community life last week in Waverly, I had a bit more this week right at home. This week is one of the semi-annual "Continuing Education Days" at the Diocese of Little Rock.

Last week with my FSSP brothers, we received instruction – quite necessary these days – on proper Human Resource Practices. Of course, this instruction targeted parishes with administrative staffs of, at least, several members. Being a staff of one around here, I don't have to worry about such things, well, not yet, anyway. We can always hope that this community grows to such a size that an administrative staff will be absolutely necessary. Let's see if we can work toward that. As I said, I'd love it if three or more Sunday Masses were necessary. I'd also love it if there were the need for a teaching staff for religious instruction on all levels, sacramental preparation and RCIA. Well, sometimes dreams come true.

The next topic presented was something that got me quite excited. I think we were presented with something that is about as close to the Holy Grail of Catholic Education we can get: A comprehensive and extensive, on-line Catholic Education Program that is based on: traditional Catholic teaching, the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, and the 1962 Liturgical Calendar. I'll have more information for you by and by, perhaps in written form or perhaps I'll need to call a special meeting or two after Sunday Mass to explain this program fully.

This week at the diocese, with the expertise of priest scripture scholar from California, we are going through the Gospel according to St. Mark, bit by bit. Though a few things unsettled me at the beginning of the talks, the bulk of subsequent material I find quite solid. Following the talk Tuesday, all of us priests went out to the House of Formation for dinner with young men discerning priestly vocations. We were also able to visit the new annex, go through all the rooms, including the Bishop's apartment. I must say, it's quite a place. It's adjacent to Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish.

We have much to look forward to in the coming weeks. To begin with, a certain priest I know will be celebrating his 10th Anniversary of ordination. I hope you're all planning to celebrate that great event with this priest of my acquaintance. More on later festivities next week, my children and my friends.
