Dear Community Members,

We proceed gradually through what the Church calls Paschal Tide. No doubt you recall my mentioning about the length of time following major feast days; that the holy “seasons” extend for 40 days. There are five Sundays after Easter, i.e., five weeks following the Resurrection, for a total of 35 days. Add on to that the five days following the Fifth Sunday after Easter (reckoning the fifth Sunday as day 1) and *viola*, you have 40 days after Easter, terminating in the Feast of the Ascension, which begins the period known as Ascension Tide. So, this Sunday and next Sunday are the last two Sundays after Easter.

Our religious education program is winding down at the same time. First Communicant parents are putting the final touches on the religious training of their children in preparation for that momentous day, the day when those children will receive the very Body and Blood of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. What a marvelous day that will be. Like last year, First Communion Sunday is the External Solemnity of Corpus Christi. We will have our traditional procession through the neighborhood and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be given at three outside altars. Following that very special Mass and procession, I imagine a special reception is planned for those three fortunate young ladies.

As we hold our yearly May Crowning, names of the First Communicants will be drawn from a hat to determine who will have the singular honor of crowning Our Lady and who will be the two distinguished members of her court. Our May crowning will take place before Mass next Sunday, 10 May which is also, by happy coincidence, Mother’s Day. What an appropriate day to honor the Mother of us all!

This Sunday begins a full month dedicated to Our Lady, yet begins, appropriately with a feast dedicated to her most chaste spouse, St. Joseph, honoring him as “The Worker.” Just as the Feast of Christ the King was Holy Mother Church’s answer to “Reformation Sunday,” so is the Feast of St. Joseph the worker her dismissive response to the evils of Communism and Atheistic Socialism. It is also a defiant “slap in the face” to the pagan Druid customs of “Maypoles” and THEIR celebration of “New Fire” which we sacralize at the Easter Vigil. It also sanitizes the Roman Celebration to Flora, the goddess of flowers.

See how Holy Mother Church cleans up the world’s dirt and makes all things new, my children and my friends?
