Dear Community Members,

Well, here we are in the last week of the Christmas Cycle. This cycle ends with the Divine Office hour of *None*, Saturday, 23 January. We begin the “pre-Lent” period of Septuagesima with First Vespers of Sunday, which follows about two hours later, on the heels of the above mentioned *None*. From the end of Vespers, when there is an exceptional, concluding double Alleluia, we will not hear that word again, nor will there be an “Alleluia” verse at any Mass, until after the Epistle at the Easter Vigil Midnight Mass.

During the short season of Septuagesima, the Sunday Mass vestments will be purple and there will be no Gloria in Excelsis. During the next three weeks, on weekdays, however, if a saint’s feast occurs, that feast will be celebrated without an Alleluia, but with a Gloria. But, following Ash Wednesday, saints’ feasts will not often be celebrated, unless they are of the first or second class, e.g. The Chair of St. Peter on 22 February; St. Matthias on 25 February, St. Thomas Aquinas on 7 March and St. Joseph on 19 March. Votive Masses are permitted on first Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Else, all days will be third class ferial days of Lent.

The season of Septuagesima should be regarded as a preparatory or “warm-up” period before the full blown abstinence, fasting, penance and mortification season of Lent bursts on the scene. It’s the time to “get our feet wet,” akin to bending and stretching before a run or a workout – yeah, like I would know!

Last Sunday, I mentioned that I’d be doing a short spot on Church Militant TV. As I write this, I still don’t know if the segment was live or will be aired at some later date. It was quite an interesting experience. It was the very first time I used “Skype” on my computer. You know what they say about what TV does to your figure?
