Dear Community Members,

As I write this, I'm in the middle of the semi-annual diocesan event known as "Continuing Clergy Education." This happens in most, if not all, (arch)dioceses. Just wanted you to know what was on my plate this week.

Father Orłowski is into his second week of substituting and, since he hasn't called to let me know he's coming home, we can all assume that things are going well for him. Substituting for other priests is one of the main things that Father's done over the years. In fact, you may remember that he did so for me in 2014. It's quite rare for a superior of a house to sub somewhere else, but I wouldn't mind doing it now and then. The sub gets all the perks and has no responsibilities. What could be better than that? And Fr. Berg, in his considerable experience, tells me that, "Father, everybody likes the substitute priest." But, hey, I have no complaints and I know y'all love me. Besides, when there are two men in an apostolate, one always has a "built-in" sub. That's quite a plus when you think of it. Know why? Well, subs can be quite expensive, what with travel reimbursement, Mass fees, etc. Anyway, as I've already mentioned, Father will be back 2 May.

After this Sunday, there is only one and a half weeks left of what we know as Paschaltide. Come 5 May, we'll be in Ascensontide. We in the traditional liturgical form will experience something that has been lost in the ordinary form. With us, following the gospel on Ascension Thursday, the Paschal Candle is extinguished. The Paschal Candle is a vibrant symbol of Christ's resurrected – but physical – presence on earth. This physical presence endured until He ascended to the Father. It's most appropriate, then, the candle be extinguished following the Ascension. For some reason, the Ordinary Form keeps the Paschal Candle burning (at Masses) until Pentecost Sunday. I've never been able to figure out why. Oh, I know there must be a reason, but, in distinction to the traditional practice, it's not obvious to me. I'll ask one of the priests at continuing ed.

I remind you that Sunday (today, if you haven't read this bulletin earlier online) is the last Sunday of the month. As such we will take our "newly traditional" building fund second collection. There have been some very generous contributions to this fund since its "revitalization" for which I am most grateful. God grant that conditions prompt its profitable use in the near future, my children and my friends.
