Dear Community Members,

I just started writing this letter to you when the phone rang. The caller ID said Dayton. I was going to ignore the call, but decided to answer. I'm glad I did. As it turned out, it was my "annual" call from Father Mark Wojdelski. He, Father Gregory Pendergraft and I were ordained together. It was nice to talk to him. We spent about an hour yakking on the phone. Father is Pastor of Holy Family Catholic Church in Dayton, OH. His website is daytonlatinmass.org. Pay a visit to the website when you get a chance. Father has a very beautiful church, probably the most beautiful church in the FSSP USA. Father Orlowski was also there for a time, as was Father Portzer.

If you're reading this letter on the day the bulletin normally appears on the website, i.e., Wednesday, you'll know, of course, that tomorrow is Ascension Thursday. It is the Ascension that completes the "ensemble" even known as the Paschal Mystery. This Mystery encompasses Our Lord's Passion and Death, His Resurrection and Ascension. These three individual mysteries are mentioned more than once in every (traditional) Mass, both in the Offertory and in the Canon.

From the Ascension to Pentecost (actually the Vigil of Pentecost, i.e., Saturday) is the time that the Church specifies as the first "novena." It was during this time, immediately following the Ascension that the Apostles, as Acts tells us, "went into an upper room" where all "were persevering with one mind in prayer with the women, and Mary, the mother of Jesus and His brethren."

It was also during this novena that the first apostolic "synod" was held, wherein Matthias was chosen and ordained and, subsequently assumed the role of apostle tossed aside by the traitor Judas Iscariot.

Thanks to one of our faithful members who provided the spiritual wherewithal, beginning Friday, 6 May, we will have an informal novena to the Holy Ghost. This novena, the oldest novena in the Church, will take the place of the prayers after Mass at Low Masses and after the sermon at the Sunday Sung Mass. Of course, from Pentecost Sunday on, we will revert to the normal prayers after Low Mass. For those who can't attend daily Mass but who want to continue the novena at home, print-outs of the novena prayers will be available on the table at the back of the church.

Father Orlowski has returned to us. He got back a little after 5PM last Monday, no worse for wear. Along with you, I'm very glad to have him back, my children and my friends.
