Dear Community Members,

Yesterday, I returned from Indianapolis, where I celebrated the wedding of two former students of Lumen Christi High School. The groom was also one of my altar servers and I served as his Confirmation sponsor.

It was a rather odd experience. True, I was able to celebrate Mass in a very beautiful church. This church was restored in 2008 and I had the honor of participating in that restoration. I engaged the artists and artisans and, pretty much, supervised the day to day. I can remember one day climbing to the top of the scaffolding right beneath the ceiling. I felt like Michelangelo. It was also wonderful to see so many familiar faces, the faces of people I served for about 7.5 years.

But I also realized that this was part of my past and that I really no longer “fit.” This is as is should be. I am no longer Associate Pastor or Administrator of Holy Rosary Church. What I am is Chaplain to this community and I wouldn’t have it otherwise. I look very much forward to the future of this community. I know the future will be fraught with difficulties, but I am confident that our future will be better than our past. If it isn’t, then the future isn’t worth much.

The only time they will appear will be during any given week when a martyr has a feast or here and there for a votive Mass. After this coming Sunday, a very exciting day for all of us, most of our Sundays will be green.

But what a Sunday we’ll have: First Holy Communions, Knights of Columbus Corporate Communion, a wonderful Eucharistic procession with four Benedictions! I will invest our First Communicants with their scapulars at the reception after the procession. I do hope as many of you as possible will be in attendance, both at the First Communion Mass and reception, my children and my friends.
