The Feast of the Precious Blood is this Friday, 1 July. There will be a Low Mass at 7:15 AM and a Sung Mass at 6:00 PM. Propers for this Mass are on page 475 of the Campion Missal/Hymnal. This is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation, but it is a first class feast, so you may eat meat if you wish. Abstinence doesn't apply.

The External Solemnity of Ss. Peter and Paul replaces the Seventh Sunday after Pentecost next Sunday, 3 July.

First Friday and First Saturday Exposition will NOT take place Friday, 1 July, but the devotion to St. Monica will be held, as normal, on Saturday, 2 July.
