Dear Community Members,

Plus ça change, plus c'est la même chose. Not quite accurate, but I just felt like inserting something French into this letter. Well, actually, things have changed a bit. This is our first Sunday to have the Sung Mass celebrated at 11:30 AM instead of at 11:00 AM. Well, *ça change, n'est-ce pas?* And now we're looking for a home. Well, I guess that does qualify as *la même chose*. Wherever we go, our Latin Mass Community always seems to be looking for a home. But, one day soon, we will have our own place. It's been a long time coming, but now it's getting more and more urgent. The small change in the Mass schedule makes this even more apparent. But, with God's help, we will not be found wanting. Yes, it will be difficult. Yes, it will be expensive. But, definitely yes, it is necessary and it will be well worth it.

To put a somewhat final word on the schedule, what I said from the pulpit last Sunday is quite true. We owe Bishop Taylor a great deal of gratitude. Though I will go into no detail, there was a great deal of "back and forth," and Bishop Taylor was of great assistance in helping us to arrive at an equitable compromise. Take a look at the Cantic of Moses in Exodus, i.e., chapter 15: 1 – 18. I will sing a new version of that cantic for you when we have our first Mass in our new place, wherever and whenever that will be.

Well, this weekend will certainly be interesting. I only hope we'll get the chance to put everything in place and that the schola/choir will get an adequate chance to rehearse for the 11:30 AM Mass. We'll see. But this is one of the very definite signs that we have to cut the cord, leave and find our own home. This is merely a portent of things to come. Now, make no mistake, I am only too happy that the Vietnamese Community will now have a home here. They have already done much work behind the scenes. They are to be congratulated for that. Though I haven't seen it, they seem to have somewhat "restored" the Shamrock House. I understand that the house will serve for their youth group and choir.

One thing we have to remember and what I **absolutely insist** on is that we will conduct ourselves with dignity, decorum, patience and grace. I'm sure St. Patrick parishioners will welcome our new Vietnamese friends, and we will welcome them with equal, if not greater, joy. We will smile and, if there is any kind of difficulty or consternation, we will take the moral high ground and give way. If there are any issues, and pray God there be none, I shall address them to competent authority before I leave on vacation.

Sunday, 9/11 is a very significant day to remember. It is also "key" for us because I want to hold a very important meeting that day. It's vital that the entire community be at that meeting. Unless you hear otherwise, there will be no 7AM Mass that Sunday. This gathering is urgent enough to cancel this Mass so all of us can be together after the 11:30 Mass. It begins our new season of second Sunday brunches anyway, and there will be many things for my "ad hoc" advisory group and me to show and tell you.
