I write this two days before the national holiday known as Thanksgiving. Of course, anyone patronizing any retail store might think that Thanksgiving follows immediately on the heels of Halloween. You can also be sure that, if stores aren't already bedecked, that Black Friday will be the national day of "mistletoe and holly." But, beware, don't any of you dare to wish anyone "Merry Christmas." You might get smacked with a lawsuit.

Anyway, I wish all of you a most Happy Thanksgiving.
