Dear Community Members,

This weekend's Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday. Remember that the "name" of the Mass comes from the first word or first words of the Introit. This Sunday's Introit begins, "Gaudete in Dómino semper, iterum dico, gaudete; Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice."

We also remember that this Sunday, the liturgical color is rose. Now, this is absolutely not required, of course. If a church cannot afford to purchase or simply does not have a set of rose vestments, purple or violet may still be used. We here at St. John had two complete sets of rose vestments. I also own a complete Low Mass set which I purchased a few years ago.

One of the things we as Catholics do is to share with those who are in need. This goes for parishes or chaplaincies too. I was made aware that one of our new parishes was experiencing growing pains of various kinds in its program to expand. I was contacted to see if we could provide anything to help. Remembering our good fortune in rose vestments, I donated one of the full rose sets to Father Define's new parish in the diocese of Tulsa. We still have the full set that we always had, as well as the use of my Low Mass set. It's our Christmas present to him and to his new parish. I'm sure you all remember Father Define fondly.

Advanced warning is probably the best, so I would like to remind you that there will be one more special collection, i.e., the diocesan collection for the Clergy Welfare Fund. Collections taken at all Christmas Day Masses will go to this fund. Due to the Christmas Masses, the Mass schedule for 24 and 25 December is as follows: Wednesday, 24 December, 7:15 AM (The Christmas Vigil Mass (i.e., the Mass for Christmas Eve)); 25 December 12:00 AM (Midnight), The First Mass of Christmas (At Night); 25 December, 7:00 AM, The Second Mass of Christmas (At Dawn); 11:00 AM, The Third Mass of Christmas (During the Day). You should notice that, apart from the Midnight Mass, the Christmas Day Masses follow the normal Sunday Schedule. This will also be the case for 1 January, the Feast of the Circumcision.

It's still only Advent and we must continue to wait, my children and my friends.
