Dear Community Members,

Gaudeamus hodie! This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday, the Birthday of the Church! We honor the Church and Her Founder in the best possible way, that is, with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Alas, it is all too frequent today to have banal, inane “quasi” rituals that have nothing but silly, sentimental meaning. I refer to the fatuous practice, in some places, of singing little “birthday ditties” to the Church (or to the Baby Jesus on Christmas). Granted, these practices are usually limited to “kiddy Masses,” but, you know what? Things like that didn’t happen when I was a little kiddy.

We here dare to present to the Father, through “alter Christus,” the Sacrifice of His Son, the unbloody Sacrifice of the Cross. Today, at 11AM, we present this Sacrifice in what was known until somewhere between the 10th and 12th centuries as the “normative” way, that is, a Solemn Mass.

We don’t often have this honor, due to unavailability of priestly personnel. We haven’t had this sublime experience since Holy Week of last year, when we welcomed Father (then Deacon) Joshua Curtis and Deacon (soon Father) Michael Malain. Today, we have the great joy to welcome Father Joseph Hearty, one of my distinguished predecessors, and Father Michael Stinson. Father Hearty serves as associate pastor at our apostolate in the Archdiocese of Denver, CO. Father Stinson presently, though not for much longer, serves as the North American District Bursar and as assistant at St. Michael the Archangel Parish in Scranton, PA, my first assignment as a priest in 2005. Father Stinson made a canonical, bursar visitation during my first year here.

It was thanks to Father Hearty that I visited this apostolate as a seminarian, some 12 years ago, or thereabout. At that time, this apostolate was at St. Mary Church. Father Hearty was engaged to lead a mission at a parish in Camden, AR. Father requested the services of two seminarians to assist him and Matt McNeely (now Father McNeely) and I were given the honor. Father requested us, actually. We three were friends in seminary. So, way back then, I visited this apostolate for the first time and now, I have the honor to be your Chaplain. Both Father Hearty and Father Stinson are here to help me celebrate my 10th Anniversary of Ordination. My actual day is/was Thursday, 21 May, but, thanks to the Handmaids of the Lord and many others who have generously given their time and worked like crazy, we celebrate it, following the beautiful Solemn Mass, featuring the wonderful music of Lorenzo Perosi, with a big “fête,” at which I hope to see all of you, my children and my friends.
