Dear Community Members,

I hope that you are all enjoying this summer and finding things to do while staying cool. It has been so hot outside! Last Sunday after the 7am Mass, which was well attended, everyone was gone after 10 minutes having got into his/her car(s) and left.

Fr. Magiera and I lost a dear friend, Mrs. Patti Bammel, this past Sunday, and, if you read this online before Sunday, we are already in Chagrin Falls, OH, with her husband. Fr. Magiera will celebrate the Solemn Requiem Thursday. He and I will return on Saturday. What this means is that there will be no Latin Masses Wednesday through Saturday, July 15 through 18. Soon, you will see Patti's name in our bulletin as I will be celebrating Gregorian Masses for her. Gregorian Masses are a series of 30 Masses offered on contiguous days. Some, I will offer publicly on Sundays. The rest I will offer privately in the rectory chapel.

To return to my little biography, the final stop I made before I entered the Fraternity of St. Peter was a nascent religious group called the Society of St. John. It began with about seven priests and as many others who had at least a college education and two even had doctorates. The community talked often about what we should be and all our opinions were asked for frequently. Those in formation to be priests had to study hard, but the policy was that the priests participate in a lot of major courses as well. I was even asked to lead a seminar on ancient Greek literature and one on St. Augustine. The method was pretty effective. You want to learn to swim? Jump into the deep end of the pool!

We prayed the office, Lauds, Vespers and Compline in common. The priests all needed servers for their low Masses, but also every day we had a Sung Mass. We had an hour of liturgy training a day in which we practiced mostly the chants for the Mass. I had never served the traditional Mass before, but I had to serve one the day after I arrived. We had a single practice and I had to memorize the Mass that night. I served everyday so I was very confident by the end of the week.

The most profound experience that I had was diving deep into the substance of the Mass itself. We were singing the Mass every day and the words and the cycle of year was very beautiful, but words themselves of the Mass were very striking to me. I had to depend on the "Liber Usualis", my chant book, which did not have translations. I knew enough Latin to be able to figure out what was being said. The offertory and the canon of the Mass struck me especially: how simple, direct, clear, powerful, august and holy is the traditional Mass. I had found my home port, my safe port amidst the storms.

Well the place was intense but the society was flippant and impatient. Things changed very fast. I was becoming hesitant about the group in a general. The funny stuff that was happening along the periphery was obscured, but the more immediate question in my mind was whether the place was good for me. I stayed longer than I planned because I got the invaluable experience of staying in Fontgombault Monastery in France for six months with them. But I left France and I literally got off the plane and was talking to Fr. Berg and Fr. Ryan, then rector of the FSSP the next day. I'll finish next time. God bless.
