Dear Community Members,

I write this on Wednesday, 30 September. The third quarter of 2015 will, in several hours, be behind us and we'll be launched into the final quarter of the year. Whenever there is a community gathering, its success is guaranteed by our two outstanding leaders of The Handmaids of the Lord. Mrs. Kathy Nauman and Mrs. Shanella Cavin, with a good deal of help from Mr. Robert Clayton, performed their typical magic, transforming the rectory parlor, dining room and kitchen into something wonderful. There were food, beverages, sweets and great fun in abundance. The children took over the dining room for their feasting and the rest of us enjoyed one another's company and great fellowship in the parlor, kitchen, halls and rectory porch. What a great time for everyone.

I would like all of us to make the effort to be present at our community events.
