Dear Community Members,

Greetings from the sovereign state of South Carolina. My brother-in-law kindly flew me down here as his guest and, again, as his guest, is housing me and feeding me – all so I can spend time with my dear sister. She's not doing so well. She has a great deal of trouble walking and, more often than not, simply falls asleep while sitting on the sofa, ostensibly watching TV. I've witnessed such phenomena in people 20 or more years her senior, but rarely in someone at the relatively young age of 61. Her face, once so pretty, seems to do little else than droop. Still, my brother-in-law, the absolute personification of patience and solicitude, and I (who must learn from him) try to keep her spirits up and divert her attention from her condition. At least she ate a hearty dinner last evening.

As I've mentioned before, she's very frail and she's always cold. Unfortunately, South Carolina is not terribly warm at the moment. It's grey, damp and windy. Though we're in a high-rise on the beach, the beach holds no temptation for me at the moment. No one is in the surf, and, after getting my feet wet Monday, I decided I wasn't going to brave the waves either.

So, apart from occasional computer breaks – where I'm praying my office this week (on a good website called 'divinumofficium.com') and writing to you – the day is mostly spent watching videos and the Fox channel.

Well, the Synod is finally over, *Deo gratias*. Though we traditional Catholics are far from claiming a victory, it seems the flaming liberals are also in the same boat. Well, scratch that. I wouldn't even share a cab with them, much less a boat. But the point is that their wish list certainly went up in smoke. True, as Michael Voris has quipped, the synod deteriorated into what Cardinal Wuerl described as a "language event."
