Dear Community Members,

Well, things are now back to normal – somewhat, at least. As I write this, Father Orłowski is packing his bags in preparation for a short trip to Irving, TX, to officiate at a wedding. He'll only be gone a short time, returning to us this Saturday, 7 November.

We had the pleasure of receiving The Very Reverend John Berg, FSSP, Superior General for a short Canonical Visitation. Such things happen every six years or so and we were “due.” Father arrived Sunday evening around 9:15 and left us about 4:30 PM Monday. Needless to say, it was quite a busy day around here on Monday. It was The Commemoration of All Souls, when all priests have the privilege of celebrating three Masses. It was quite a juggling act to ensure that each of us were able to celebrate our allotted three Masses. It was a bit easier for me, of course, since my Masses were all scheduled and were celebrated in the church.

I'm happy to report that Father Berg was pleased both with Father Orłowski and myself and with the Apostolate. Father required quite a bit of detailed reporting on things ranging from records, finances, communications, statistics and, to use a very apt term, the overall “health” of the Apostolate. Of somewhat greater importance were the interviews he conducted with me and with Father Orłowski. Here, we covered such important topics as community life, spiritual/prayer life, interpersonal communication, leisure and health, i.e., the more “human” aspects. Our Apostolate, Father Orłowski and I not only passed with “flying colors,” but I believed we achieved the distinction of “Summa cum Laude.”

We couldn't have done it without all of you. Both Father and I are grateful for your support, cooperation and affection.

Father and I are going to have to cash in a little bit on that support, cooperation as well as a good bit of understanding in the near future. Why? Just as we are always trying to inspire an increase in our spiritual and community life, so Father Ngandu is trying to do the same with St. Patrick. His plans include increasing the number of Masses here, specifically, civic holiday Masses and Holy Day Masses. To that end, he has asked us for a bit of flexibility in scheduling and I, therefore, must ask the same of you. I guarantee it will not be a burden, since we've already operated, off and on, with a similar schedule in the past. We will be affected only two times in the remaining weeks of 2015, specifically, Thanksgiving and Immaculate Conception. Instead of a 9AM Mass on Thanksgiving, we will have 8AM Mass. Instead of 6PM Mass on Immaculate Conception, it will be at 7PM. And so will be our pattern. We'll have to see if St. Patrick parishioners respond to this augmented schedule. If they do, all well and good. If they do not, well then I imagine we will return to what we've been doing over the past year. Cooperation is always important, my children and my friends.
