Dear Community Members,

This is my last letter to you for the month of August. Obviously, I wrote it before I left for my vacation. If you haven't read this letter yet, and you're just getting to it Sunday, well, I (will) have been in Florida for about 44 to 48 hours, depending on whether you're at the 7 AM Mass or the 11:30 AM Mass. I touched down about 11:30 Friday, the 12<sup>th</sup> and we got into the house Saturday about 2 PM. Father Orłowski will be writing the bulletin letters for the next two Sundays, i.e., the 21<sup>st</sup> and the 28<sup>th</sup>.

Well, we made it through last weekend's Mass schedule change unscathed. Mr. Pyron and I prepared for any eventual schedule scare or bottleneck. Everything for the 11:30 Sunday Mass was pre-staged on the credence table so it could be put in its proper place in a few seconds. I prepared myself by taking all necessary vestments to my rectory and by deciding to have confessions there in order to avoid any traffic jams and unpleasantness. I believe it prudent to continue this procedure for the next two to three weeks or so. This will enable us to get a better "bead" on timing. We may then be able to relax a bit and, at least, get confessions back in the church. Yes, of course, this is the ideal and, in this time of "transition," I want that very much. Let's just be a bit more patient and I will see how things go when I return.

I'm of the opinion that the schedule change did not have an adverse effect on attendance. It shouldn't really. After all, it's only a matter of a half-hour. Yet, I know that even such minor disturbances could have "ripple effects," against which we all have to be on our guard. Now, more than ever before, all of us should realize how much more we have to be united in our apostolate, its purpose and mission and in our intention to head out to a "pasture" that is ours. For the moment at least, perhaps our new motto should be the famous, "Per Aspera ad Astra," through hardships to the stars. This is a rather ubiquitous phrase, used as the motto for cities, states (e.g., Kansas; here it is inverted, however), military organizations and educational institutions and is found all over the place in literature. It is, after all, an apt description of what life in this earthly vale of tears is like. Our Lord tells us that the road to salvation is the narrow, rough, difficult way, rather than the wide, bright, pleasant and easy way. Though our road to self-reliance might not be easy, a positive attitude, knowing that Divine Providence will not fail us, will ensure that we reach the end in good measure.

Please remember the building fund collection on 8/28. The weekend after I return will be Labor Day weekend. Please remember that Mass on Labor Day will be at 9 AM.

Also, please remember that I asked, urged all of you to attend the 11:30 AM Mass on Sunday, 9/11. There will be no 7AM Mass that day. Yes, it's the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of a tragedy of apocalyptic proportions. But it will also be a significant "rebirthing" day for our community. Please plan to go to the hall after Mass for our first Second Sunday Brunch. Either after or during, we'll hear some interesting stuff about our position and plans for our move to our new home. It's important, my children and my friends.
