Dear Community Members,

If you read last week's bulletin, then you know that Fr. Magiera is away on vacation. He picked me up at the airport Thursday night and I dropped him off early the next morning for his trip. He wrote the bulletin letter which you could pick up this last weekend but I was the only priest here in the community last weekend. It was my first time preparing for mass with the new schedule because two weeks prior at the end of July I had gone to New Blaine after I had said the 7am Mass and the first Sunday of August I was "on vacation." (I was actually very busy on the trip.)

When I got off the plane that Thursday night Fr. Magiera handed me five pages of notes about the changes, subsequent changes to the changes and a covering letter for the changes. (You may remember Fr. Magiera sharing with you that he likes to write.) Mr. Pyron believes that careful analysis of the notes reveals that I do not have to do that much more to prepare for the 11:30 Mass but nevertheless I tried to pre-stage everything on Saturday night and I realized that I did not know how the incense was prepared here at the parish and how it was cleaned afterwards even though I have been here for over a year. You may have noticed the altar cards were different; we will be using them temporarily until we come up with a different solution. It was satisfying to see that everything seemed to fall into place for the actual Mass.

In addition the new Sunday time, St. Pat's now has an 8am Mass, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and they just had the first Mass this Wednesday morning. I have already made adjustments for these additional Mass times in the schedule so that the transitions back and forth will be as smooth as possible.

There was also last weekend the last minute changing schedule for the Assumption Masses. I am sorry for that, but it was nice that so many showed up for the 6am Mass and it was wonderful to see that 83 people showed up in the evening for the 6pm Mass. It occurred to me that our Lord knows how much devotion you have for our Lady and wanted you to be able to receive the special graces for honoring her on the great feast of her Assumption with a sung Mass in the extraordinary form. You also were able to have the Mass, because you have already made so many sacrifices to come in the past for great feasts and even for those which were not holy days of obligation.

So despite that fact that it was a crazy "long" weekend and that there were a lot of new things that I had to deal with, we should all be assured because everything went well. Please pray that I can keep everything running smoothly until Fr. Magiera gets back and that we will not have created too much work for when he gets back.
