Dear Community Members,

I mentioned in last week's bulletin that at the beginning of August I was "on vacation." I put the words in quotes because the purpose of the trip was to do my part to assist my mom in moving from her present house to a home in Virginia where she can be near two of my siblings. The trip was mostly work: fulfilling some things in the contract for the closing date, having things thrown away, selling things at a garage sale, preparing for packing date, packing day, loading the "PODS" the next day, figuring out with the agents a calendar of events for the closing sale and buying date and tying up all kinds of loose ends like cancelling phone and utilities, and managing bank accounts. Almost all of our family, my mom, my siblings and I had been planning the details of her move, for months but there were still a lot of unknowns leading up to packing then moving day and about the closings. My mom and I slept well each night because we were tired and we also knew that worrying would just make things worse. It was still satisfying when things fell into place. Despite the fact that she is moving, my mom went to a rosary group because she thought she owed Our Lady for making resolving all the issue involved in the move and making it run smoothly.

Despite the work on the trip I was able have some interesting experiences in the Northwest, I landed in Seattle and was able to visit a sister in Chehalis, Washington. The next morning which was a Wednesday I saw our apostolate in Tacoma for the first time. I was able to say a votive mass of St. Joseph, at a side altar of St. Joseph at the parish that bears his name. I could not help but think of our community and our Novena we began in June for our new home. I went from there to pick up my mom in Seattle and visited my brother's grave with her. I also was able to see parts of the Vancouver and it suburbs (in British Columbia referred to as the lower mainland.) Both cities and suburbs are characterized by an increase in traffic, more and bigger trees but always lots of sea and high mountains. I was shocked to see all the high rises that had been built in the Vancouver suburbs along commuter rail lines.

The deepest impact that the trip made on us was that my family would never see things again. We were leaving for the city, the house and many objects for good. One of the last things we sold was my dad's ladder. It was of solid 40 foot aluminum extension ladder of solid construction, we had used it for over three decades on so many projects. It was particularly hard to say good bye to the house that not only had some many memories but I myself had helped to work on and Fr. Huang, FSSP and Fr. Mcdonell, FSSP had helped as seminarians on the house. Having to move, sell and dispose of so much stuff reminded me that possessions are often just a punishment! You have to care and maintain them, make allowances for their placement or storage and ultimately they will gang up on you and require your hard work when you have to relinquish and move them en masse. I supposed this helps us to leave the things of greater value, especially the house itself. When we are leaving a home it should remind us that we need to be deeply detached from the things of this world. After all we are on a journey in which we at some point will have to leave all our money and each and everything that we have acquired.

My mom is leaving on August 27<sup>th</sup> and she will be here this weekend as you read this bulletin. I am sure she would like to meet you and now you know a little bit about her.
